



# Commitment To Canterbury's Holistic Educational Program

By accepting your enrolment here at Canterbury College, and continuing your ongoing partnership with us each year, parents, carers and students confirm their support for Canterbury's holistic approach to student development.

This includes a commitment to willingly attend and participate in the following areas:

## Outdoor Education

Every year from Years 3 – 11, an age-appropriate Outdoor Education Camp of 2 – 5 days duration is arranged, designed to challenge and reward students with all levels of experience and confidence.

## Chapel Services

This typically consists of class, year level and house school services, plus one special city service per year at St John's Cathedral.

These services are inclusive of all religions and beliefs, in keeping with our Anglican Values.

## Religious and Values Education (RaVE)

This curriculum program is designed to encourage all students, regardless of their faith journey or spiritual development, to understand our Anglican heritage and learn more about all world religions.

## Wellbeing Program

Throughout the year, we offer an age-appropriate timetabled Wellbeing curriculum, with guest speakers and special events tailored to year levels, which promotes our students' social, emotional and mental health.

## Academic Program

From Years 4 – 10 or 12, students use a College-provided laptop that is included within the Single Resource Charge.

This is **not** an optional extra and guarantees zero interruption to learning in the event of breakage or malfunctions.

## Co-Curricular Program

We ask students in the Junior School to try **one** co-curricular activity per year from the options in Sport, The Arts and Thought Sports.

In the Secondary School, we expect students to take part in **three** co-curricular activities per year, including at least **one** team-based Sport across the three TAS trimesters of Years 7 – 8.

There are a wide range of Entrepreneurship, Sport, Music, Dance, Drama, Art, eSports, Gaming, Chess, Debating, Science, Kitchen Garden and other academic clubs and societies to choose from.

## House Events

At Canterbury, every student outside our Early Learning Centre belongs to one of six houses.

This forms a key component of the school identity and the community that supports our students.

During the year, there are a range of house events scheduled, designed to strengthen house connections and build house spirit.

We expect every student to be present at, and fully participate in, all house events to the best of their ability.
