Senior Library

The Senior Library is located at the centre of our senior campus.

Monday - Thursday: 7:30am - 5:00pm.

Friday: 7:30am - 4:30pm.

Our two-storey library provides both fiction and non-fiction resources in hard copy and digital formats.

A large range of indoor activities, board games, card games and 'thought sports' can also be played here with friends during school breaks.

Whisper Wednesday provides a quiet day for students to focus on their studies or reading, so games and activities are not available during breaks on Wednesdays.



Senior School Administration

The Senior School Administration office is where you go:

- To sign in if you are late for school.
- To meet your parents or carers to sign out, if you are leaving school early.
- To hand in your phone before the first bell, and to collect your phone when school ends each day.



Care Central Services

Located at Easterly Street's main gate roundabout, Care Central is a 'one stop shop' for every student from Prep to Year 12 requiring:



- first aid treatment
- medication dispensing
- Sick Bay bedding and attention
- individual, small group or family unit counselling
- mental health and general wellbeing advice
- dispute mediation and conflict resolution
- referrals to external allied health professionals such as psychiatrists, paediatricians and psychologists.

Care Central staffing includes counsellors, nurses, and a paramedic, along with friendly administration staff to support all students.



IT Services

Our IT Services are located opposite the Senior Library for any laptop, operating system and/or software queries with our friendly service staff.

1:1 Devices

Year 7 students are part of the Canterbury 1:1 Device Program, where you are provided with a Surface Pro laptop computer with keyboard, stylus, protective case, carry bag, warranty, insurance plan, and all the fully licensed software and IT support services you need.

All class work and homework assignments can be completed on your laptop using the keyboard, along with the stylus for any handwriting required.



MyCC: My Canterbury College

MyCC is Canterbury's complete communications, events, teaching, learning and co-curricular web portal installed on your device.

It gives you full access to our education faculties, class pages, events calendar, news updates, sport fixtures, arts performances, co-curricular clubs, 'thought sports', important notices, student services, school policies, free learning resources, class timetables, staff directories and more.

Most importantly, it allows you to directly track your academic progress, assignment submissions and exam assessment results – even your weekly homework tasks!

Every student and parent/carer is given a MyCC login, and there is a 'How To Use MyCC' Information Video (27 minutes) searchable on our website News section and YouTube channel.

Our impressive sports facilities include six playing fields, multi-purpose outdoor courts, indoor and outdoor gym, cricket nets, long jump and triple jump pit, and two huge sports halls for netball, basketball and volleyball.

Our Canterbury Taipans high performance centre features a heated 10-lane 50-metre Olympic-size lap pool, heated undercover Learn To Swim pool, eight tournament standard tennis courts, and a full professional athletics facility - including the ex-Gold Coast Commonwealth Games running track.

Our Canteen is available every day for healthy morning teas, lunches, drinks and snacks. It is a great place for students to hang out before school, with breakfast items also available.

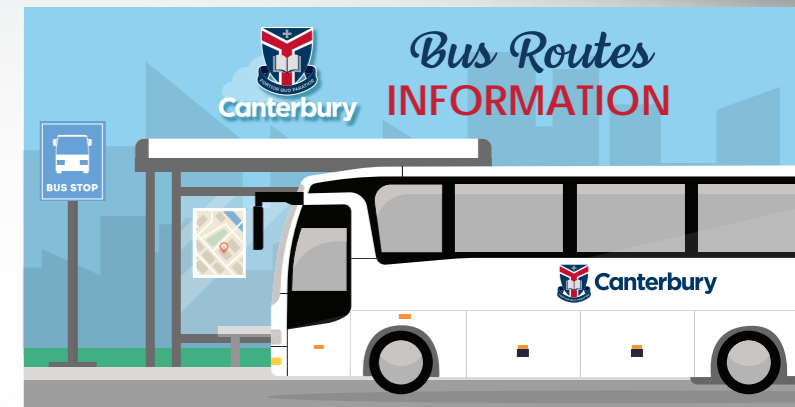
The Canteen is cashless, which means you need to pre-load money onto your Student ID Card, then swipe that card to make purchases.
